ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, cuddle them and say: "Good morning, [child's name]! Can you guess what I am? (flap arms like a bird) Yes! I'm a bird! Now can you guess what I am? (make a fish face) You got it! I'm a fish! God made all of the birds and sea animals!"



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child and pray: "God, thank You for making the [child's favorite sea animal]. It is [name of child]'s favorite! Mine is the [favorite sea animal]. I think it is so cool because [say why]. You are so creative, God! Only You can make everything!"



Drive Time

While on the go, name as many different birds as you can think of. Then have everyone answer this question: "If you could have any kind of bird for a pet, what kind of bird would you want to have?" Talk about how amazing and creative God is to have made so many different birds!



Bath Time

Add lots of pom poms and a bowl to bath time. Tell your child to pretend the pom poms are fish. Their job is to catch all of the fish with their hands and put them in the bowl. As they catch the fish, talk about how God made all the animals that live in the sea!
