

Week 10: All Things New

Revelation 21 & 22 don't show us the end of the world, but a renewed one. A world where heaven comes down, the curse is reversed, and God's presence fills the earth. These final chapters unveil a garden-city where the Tree of Life flourishes, and every tear is wiped away. The question they leave us with is deeply personal: *Will you be there?* If yes, then you have every reason to live with heart-filled hope. If not, then you still have an invitation. The Lamb's Book of Life is not yet closed.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. **Read Revelation 21:1-8.** The word, *new,* in Greek is *kainos*, meaning "new in nature or quality." What does that reveal about God's plan for the future? How does the reaffirm or reshape your view of heaven?
- 2. What emotions does **Revelation 21:4** stir in you? Is there a particular wound, grief, or loss you long to see healed in the new creation?
- 3. **Revelation 22:3** says, "There will no longer be any curse." How have you felt the weight of the curse in your life? What do you most look forward to in a new creation without the curse?
- 4. The Tree of Life reappears. Why is that significant? How does it connect to the overall story of Scripture?
- 5. Why is the Lamb so central to the final vision of Revelation? How should that shape our worship, our trust, and our obedience today?
- 6. What do you think it will be like to "see His face" (22:4)? How does that stir your worship or desire for God now?
- 7. As you reflect on our journey through Revelation, what's your biggest theological or spiritual insight? Has your view of God, the world, or your calling shifted in any way?
