



Week 9: His Coming, Our Comeback

Revelation 19-20 shows us Jesus' ultimate defeat over evil. Despite the battles we face in life, we can take heart knowing that the final outcome has already been determined. Jesus has already won the battle on the cross, and when He returns, He will destroy evil once and for all. We can live confidently knowing that even though evil seems to be winning, our comeback is guaranteed and our victory assured.

Discussion Questions:

1. **Read Revelation 19:11-21.** What stirs in you as you read this text? What does this imagery tell us about Jesus' role in the final victory over evil? How does it differ from the first coming of Jesus? Why do you think there is such a difference?
2. How does this text challenge or change your perception of Jesus as both Savior (first coming) and Judge (second coming)?
3. **Read Revelation 20:1-10.** Discuss (respectfully) the different views of the millennium (Premillennialism, Postmillennialism, Amillennialism). Which view, if any, do you ascribe to and why? How do these views shape our understanding of the kingdom of God and our role in it? What is the importance of unity despite differing views on the end times?
4. How did the first coming of Jesus "bind" Satan? Where do we see evidence of that in the gospels? In the world today? If Satan is already bound, what does this mean for the Church and for us personally? What has the enemy "plundered" in your life that Jesus gives you the authority to take back?
5. Jesus' return will bring the end of all evil and suffering. How does this ensure our own comeback and victory from pain, suffering, and brokenness? Who in your life needs to hear about this hope right now? This week, spend time praying for them and for an opportunity to share this great hope.
