ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, cuddle them and say: "Good morning, [child's name]! I'm so glad being your [mommy/daddy] is a part of God's plans. I think you're awesome, and I love you!"



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child and pray: "God, waiting can be hard. It's hard to wait for cookies to bake. It's hard to wait for our birthday to get here. And it's really hard to wait for Christmas morning! But we know that Your plans are always best, so please help [child's name] and me wait for You."



Drive Time

While on the go, talk about things you both have waited a long time for (birthday, Christmas morning, etc.). Then say: "Abraham and Sarah waited a long time to have a baby. Then, they finally had one, just like God said they would! They waited on God's plans, and we can wait for God's plans too."



Bath Time

Add bubbles to bath time. Scoop bubbles in your hand for your child to blow. Tell them to wait for you to say, "GO!" before they blow. Make your child wait longer and longer to blow the bubbles. Then, say: "You waited to blow the bubbles. And guess what! You can wait for God's plans too!"
