ENGAGE IN EVERYDAY MOMENTS TOGETHER



Morning Time

When you go into your child's room, cuddle them and say: "Good morning, [child's name]! Do you know why you can be brave and I can be brave today? We can be brave because God will be with us wherever we go."



Cuddle Time

Cuddle with your child and pray: "God, There is no one more powerful than You! Please help us remember that You are always with us, because knowing You are with us helps us be brave."



Drive Time

While on the go, look for the tallest person in each place. Talk about how Goliath was the tallest person when young David walked up. Even though David was smaller, he was brave because he knew God was with him.



Bath Time

Add bubbles to bath time. Drop tin foil balls in the water. Tell your child to pretend the balls are stones and find them. Talk about how David was brave because he knew God was with him. He looked for some smooth stones, took his sling, and he won against tall Goliath with just one stone!
