



Week 2: The Promise Fulfilled

Pentecost marks the birth of the Church. What Jesus accomplished at the cross is applied through the Spirit, who now dwells within God's people to bring both power for mission and purity for transformation. The same Spirit who raised Jesus now fills ordinary believers to bear witness to Him everywhere. Pentecost didn't end the story—it ignited a movement that continues through the Church today.

Discussion Questions:

1. **Read Acts 2:1-13.** When you think about the Holy Spirit, what words or experiences come to mind? How has your understanding of the Spirit grown or changed over time?
2. Where do you most feel the temptation to rely on your own strength rather than the Spirit's power in your daily life?
3. How does understanding the connection between Passover (redemption accomplished) and Pentecost (redemption applied) deepen your appreciation of what God has done for you?
4. The Spirit brings both power for mission and purity for transformation. Which of those do you tend to pursue more naturally, and how might God be inviting you to hold the two together?
5. Can you think of a season where you sensed God giving you strength, courage, wisdom, or ability beyond your own? What was it for and how did it turn out? How did that shape your trust and dependence on Him?
6. Pentecost multiplied Jesus' presence through His people. What is one simple prayer or step you can take this week to be more attentive to the Spirit's leading and power?
