3. The early church practiced a faith that was visible and shared, not private. Where do you tend to keep your faith individual instead of communal—and why?
4. They devoted themselves to teaching, fellowship, breaking bread, and prayer. Which of these is most present in your life right now—and which is most neglected?
5. If someone patterned their walk with Jesus after yours, what would they learn about what it truly means to follow Him in everyday life?
