



Week 12: Wrecked By Grace

A divine interruption can expose what we've been trusting in and redirect us to what truly matters. When you're wrecked by grace, surrender replaces control and obedience becomes the pathway to real transformation. Saul's surrender and Ananias' obedience show how God uses ordinary people to change lives—including our own and the people around us.

Discussion Questions:

1. **Read Acts 9:1-31.** Saul thought he was doing the right thing but was actually opposing God. Where in your life might you be believing an “almost-truth” that needs to be corrected by Jesus?
2. Describe a time when your life was “interrupted” in a way that changed your direction. How did you respond—and what did you learn from it?
3. The phrase “wrecked by grace” describes a life transformed by Jesus. What would it look like for you to fully surrender and stop resisting what Jesus is asking of you right now?
4. Ananias didn't just obey—he embraced Saul as family. Is there anyone in your life who would be hard for you to welcome, forgive, or move toward? What would obedience look like in that relationship?
5. Ananias didn't just accept Saul—he helped him take his next step with Jesus. Who is one person you can intentionally invest in this week to help them move closer to Christ?
6. If being used by God often comes through interruption, what might your resistance to interruption reveal about your priorities?
