



Week 30: Acts 29

The book of Acts ends in a surprising way—with no real ending. Paul makes it to Rome, the Gospel is still advancing, and then Luke simply puts down his pen. Why? Because the story was never just about Paul, and the mission was never meant to end with him. For 2,000 years, the Holy Spirit has continued working through ordinary followers of Jesus to carry an unstoppable Gospel from one generation to the next. Now the story has reached us. Acts 28 is finished, but the story isn't. We're the next chapter.

Discussion Questions:

1. Paul arrived in Rome very differently than he probably imagined. Where have you seen God accomplish something in your life through circumstances you wouldn't have chosen?
2. Paul continued proclaiming Jesus even while living in chains. What circumstances in your life are most likely to become an excuse for putting your faith or mission on hold?
3. We're here because somebody before us refused to let the story stop with them. Who helped carry the story of Jesus to you, and how did their faithfulness impact your life?
4. If we really believe we're living in "Acts 29," what would it look like for you to see yourself as an active participant in God's mission rather than simply someone who attends church?
5. As you reflect on our journey through Acts, how has it shaped your understanding of God's plan of redemption and your role in it?
6. As you close, spend time praying specifically for our church and the Multiply 2030 Vision as, together, we lean into the story God is still writing.
