



Week 3: Do What Jesus Did

Following Jesus always leads to living on mission. As we spend time with Jesus and become like Jesus, He sends us into the world to represent Him and to join Him in bringing hope, healing, compassion, and reconciliation to a broken world.

Discussion Questions:

1. Jesus says, "As the Father has sent me, I also send you" (John 20:21). When you hear the phrase "I have been sent," how does that change the way you think about your normal routines, relationships, workplace, neighborhood, or family?
2. The message asked, "What would Jesus do if He were me?" Think about your specific personality, schedule, responsibilities, resources, and relationships. Where is one area of your life where asking that question could genuinely change the way you respond or behave?
3. Romans 10 reminds us that eventually the Gospel has to become words. What makes talking about Jesus difficult for you? What would it look like to talk about your faith in a way that is natural, loving, and honest rather than forced?
4. Jesus didn't only proclaim the Kingdom; He demonstrated it by serving, praying, healing, welcoming, and caring for people. Where do you currently see hurt, loneliness, need, or brokenness around you? How could you represent Jesus in that situation this week?
5. Jesus' command to go in John 20:21 is immediately followed by "Receive the Holy Spirit" in verse 22. Why is that connection important? Where might God be asking you to depend less on your own ability and become more available and obedient to the Holy Spirit?
